Informational Bulletin Regarding Emergency Declaration – Winter Storms

This is an advisory notification to Molina Healthcare of California (MHC) network providers.

On March 1, 2023, California Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a state of emergency due to winter storms in Amador, Kern, Los Angeles, Madera, Mariposa, Mono, Nevada, San Bernardino, San Luis Obispo, Santa Barbara, Sierra, Sonoma, and Tulare.

On March 8, 2023 California Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a State of Emergency to 21 additional counties in Butte, El Dorado, Fresno, Humboldt, Imperial, Inyo, Lake, Mendocino, Merced, Monterey, Napa, Placer, Plumas, Sacramento, San Francisco, San Mateo, Santa Clara, Santa Cruz, Stanislaus, Tuolumne, and Yuba counties to support storm response and relief efforts.

On March 14, 2023 California Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed a State of Emergency to 3 additional counties in Alpine, Orange and Trinity, which join 40 counties that the Governor has previously proclaimed a state of emergency for since the start of severe winter storms.

On April 20, 2023, California Governor Gavin Newsom proclaimed another Winter Storm State of Emergency to add 4 additional counties, including Contra Costa, Riverside, San Diego, and Yolo counties.
